# **Supported Internships**

Currently 5% of young people with learning difficulties and autism find paid employment. We are working to change this and one route to employment is through a Supported Internship.

Supported Internships are available for young people with an EHCP, are based in the workplace with support from the education provider and job coach.

### **Apprenticeships**

Students with a learning difficulty or disability have rights that protect apprentices against discrimination.

Support for apprentices with a learning difficulty or disability (apprenticeships.gov.uk)

Extra support can be provided to apprentices if they have:

- learning difficulty
- disability
- physical or mental health condition

The employer and training provider should review reasonable adjustments throughout the apprenticeship. Employers also be able to claim financial support towards the reasonable adjustments through Access to Work (see below).

### **Access to Work**

Access to Work is a government scheme that offers grants to apprentices to help them pay for any reasonable adjustments they need. You could be eligible for a grant if you have a:

- disability
- health condition
- mental health condition

The support you get will depend on your needs. You could get a grant to help pay for things like:

- british sign language interpreters, lip speakers or note takers
- adaptations to your vehicle so you can get to work
- taxi fares to work or a support worker if you cannot use public transport
- a support worker or job coach to help you in your workplace

If a young person living in Cornwall aged 16-24 is not in education employment or training (NEET) or is at risk of becoming NEET then they are eligible form support from the UKSPF funded project.
